

News Release: Employment Situation of Veterans

A news release of the 2021 Employment Situation of Veterans report was published. The information was obtained from the Current Population Survey (CPS), a monthly survey of about 60,000 eligible households.



Veterans Unemployment Matching Historic Low

On April 21, 2022, a statement was released on historically low veteran unemployment. The unemployment rate for veterans is 2.4 percent, tied for the lowest rate on record and down from an average of 6.5 percent in 2020.



Get Internet | The White House

The White House announced the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) for universal broadband expansion to provide affordable internet access to eligible households for no more than \$30/month through one of twenty different participating internet providers. This could be a life-changing resource for people who might already have internet access but have difficulty affording it. The ACP can help alleviate challenges for rural, tribal, and vulnerable veterans, including veterans experiencing homelessness, and veterans entering/re-entering the workforce.

Professional Highlight: Presented at the 2021 Coalition on Ending Homelessness Conference and the National Alliance to End Homelessness COVID-19 Series.


