


SITREP NYC Podcast

Fake Claims Threaten Camp Lejeune Toxic Water Payouts to Veterans

A <u>wave of fraudulent claims</u> may threaten to disrupt government plans to pay billions to victims of toxic water at Camp Lejeune. Numerous firms have discovered hundreds of suspicious claims, including doctored medical records, fictional reports of diseases or

sicknesses, and incorrect home addresses. These fake claims could slow down the filings and payout to victims, as the government is already struggling to handle thousands of claims.



Food-Insecure Veterans Are Less Likely to Seek Help Than Civilians

A <u>recent article in the War Horse</u> sheds light on the fact that veterans who are food insecure are less likely to look for help when compared to civilians. Possible reasons for these disparities include pride and challenges enrolling in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).



U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) Increase Surgery Access for Gulf Coast Veterans

The VA and DOD have partnered to <u>increase access to surgical care</u> for approximately 37,000 Gulf Coast-area veterans. Veterans in the Gulf Coast region have already begun receiving ambulatory surgical care from VA clinicians at the new VA clinic in Naval Hospital Pensacola. The VA plans to expand surgery access for veterans at the DoD facility, adding services that include orthopedics; ear, nose, and throat; podiatry; ophthalmology; and urology.

Veterans Legacy Memorial (VLM) Project Adds 5 Million Veterans

In preparation for Veterans Day, federal officials added roughly <u>5 million veterans</u> <u>buried at private cemeteries to the VLM project</u>, the nation's first digital platform dedicated to the memory of nearly 10 million veterans. The initiative nearly doubled the number of individuals honored with online memorial pages.

"This is our most ambitious expansion of the project since its creation, and brings the online platform to private cemeteries large and small across the country, wherever those heroes have been laid to rest," said Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs Matt Quinn. "Now these family members and their fellow veterans can access the personal pages of their loved ones and upload photographs and other mementos to help preserve their legacies."




Vietnam Veteran Composed Opera to Honor Black Veterans of World War I
