Questions and Answers (Q&A)

Overview

The following Q&A document provides responses to questions posed at the HVRP Information Session intended for organizations serving Wyoming held on August 21, 2024. Questions have been synthesized for clarity.

Q&A

Q: Does the HVRP grant allow for subrecipients?

A: Yes! One organization must apply for the HVRP grant. This organization's name, employer identification number (EIN), and unique entity identifier (UEI) must appear on the Standard Form (SF)-424. If selected for an award, the applicant is responsible for complying with all federal award requirements, per 2 CFR 200.300(b). The applicant/recipient may partner with other organizations, which may include for profit entities, to support the successful reintegration of veterans experiencing homelessness into the labor force.

Applicants may propose in their application under the project and budget narrative that they plan to have a partner classified as a contractor or subrecipient. Guidance in determining the categorization may be found at 2 CFR 200.331. The applicant/recipient is responsible for determining a partner's classification as a contractor or subrecipient, if applicable. The applicant should describe and categorize the proposed partnerships in their project narrative.

The Uniform Guidance stipulates that the classification of a subrecipient must be based on function and substance per the criteria outlined in 2 CFR 200.331. A subrecipient may not earn or keep any profit resulting from federal financial assistance unless explicitly authorized by the terms and conditions of the federal award, per 2 CFR 200.400(g). The HVRP terms and conditions do not authorize recipients or subrecipients to earn or keep a profit. A recipient is responsible for ensuring a subrecipient's services exclude profit.
