Free Yoga and Mindfulness Classes for Veterans

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), in partnership with the nonprofit Veterans Yoga Project, offers free yoga and mindfulness classes to veterans nationwide, both in-person and online. These classes aim to improve veterans' mental, physical, and emotional health while addressing stress and pain management, with 72 percent of participants reporting reduced pain and 75 percent experiencing less distress. Delivered through VA medical centers or telehealth platforms, the initiative supports the VA's Whole Health approach, promoting personalized, whole-person care. By expanding access and fostering local partnerships, this collaboration empowers veterans to enhance resilience and well-being through over 100 weekly classes.

Paws of War: New York, Florida, and North Carolina

Founded in 2014, Paws of War is a nonprofit based in New York, with chapters in Florida and North Carolina. Dedicated to helping veterans, active military members, and first responders, they “enrich their lives through the rescue and training of service dogs for independence, adoption of companion animals, rescue of overseas animals in war zones, and other essential services to assist our heroes in need.” Paws of War offers a range of programs, including service dog training, no cost mobile veterinary clinics, therapy dog program for veterans, emergency fosters for hospitalized veterans, and housing assistance for veterans with pets. For homeless veterans with emotional support or service animals, which often limits access to housing options, Paws of War finds short-term temporary or long-term homes. If animals are not permitted in a shelter, or the owner has other extenuating circumstances, they will foster the animal at their facility. Available Now: Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Funding Opportunity

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program is excited to announce that the Fiscal Year (FY) 26 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is now available. This grant opportunity is open to new applicants as well as existing grantees seeking to renew their grant. The principal goal of this NOFO is to seek entities that have the greatest capacity to end homelessness among Veterans or sustain gains made in ending homelessness among Veterans. Priority will be given to grantees who can demonstrate the adoption of evidence-based practices in their application. Key Trends in Veteran Suicide Prevention and Ongoing Efforts to Save Lives

The VA released its National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, providing a comprehensive analysis of veteran suicides from 2001 to 2022. The report highlighted key findings, including a 24.1 percent decrease in suicide rates for female veterans, a 19.1 percent reduction for veterans experiencing homelessness, and a decline in suicide rates for younger veterans (aged 18-34) by 3.8 percent. Veterans with mental health conditions also saw long-term reductions in suicide rates. The VA's suicide prevention efforts have expanded significantly, focusing on immediate support through initiatives like the Veterans Crisis Line and national awareness campaigns. The VA, along with the Biden-Harris Administration, remains committed to addressing veteran suicide through both clinical and community-based strategies. Secretary of Veterans Affairs Denis McDonough emphasized the critical priority of ending veteran suicide, noting that the VA will continue learning from these reports to improve care and save lives.
